


The Moravian Star hanging in the Chancel represents the star followed by the Magi, and the light of Christ illuminating our path in the world today. The first Moravian star is known to have originated in the 1830s at the Moravian Boy's School in Niesky, Germany. Since that time they have been used during Advent in countries throughout the world, but particularly where Moravian missionaries were active. In the United States, they are most prominent in Winston-Salem, NC, a city founded by Moravians in 1733. A 31-foot Moravian star, one of the largest in the world, sits atop a tower at the Wake Forest University Medical Center during Advent and Christmas.



Today is Communion Sunday. As we are fed at the Lord's Table, we also come to feed others and lend support to our neighbors in need. **Our January donations and financial contributions support Food Gatherers, the main supplier of food to local food banks in Washtenaw County.** Non-perishable food may be placed in the bin provided in the Social Hall on Sundays, Mondays–Thursdays, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Fridays 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Financial gifts may be made by check or online. Personal care items are of particular need since they cannot be purchased with Bridge Cards. The most needed food items include low sodium soups, canned meats and vegetables, pasta, rice, cereal, oatmeal, granola bars, nut butters, jelly, baby food and formula, and Ensure or other nutritional supplement drinks. The most needed personal care items are diapers, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, shampoo, and disposable razors. Donations will be coordinated by the First Pres Local Missions team.

December Tornado Response. Saturday afternoon, December 11, in the face of devastating loss after a tornado destroyed their historic building on the previous Friday evening, First Presbyterian Church of Mayfield, Kentucky invoked Scripture:

“The bricks have fallen down, But we will rebuild with smooth stones;
The sycamores have been cut down, But we will replace with cedars.” (Isaiah 9:10)

The catastrophic destruction of Mayfield is one but one of the harrowing stories from Western Kentucky after a massive tornado ripped through six states in the mid-section of the U.S. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) has deployed a team to the area, and expects both short and long-term relief efforts.
