Although this unity is integral to each celebration of the Lord's Supper, today we place special emphasis on it through our use of global music, fabrics from around the world, and communion bread.



WELCOME TO WORSHIP!

Why origami cranes? Early in 1955, a twelve-year-old girl named Sadako Sasaki developed leukemia as a result of exposure to radiation from the nuclear bomb dropped on her hometown, Hiroshima, at the end of World War II. Visiting her in the hospital, Sadako's best friend reminded her of the Japanese legend that, if she could fold one thousand cranes, her wish to be made well might be granted. Stories differ as to whether Sadako was able to finish one thousand cranes before her death in October 1955, or whether her friends completed the task in her memory. Regardless, a statue of Sadako holding a golden crane now stands in the Hiroshima Peace Memorial and, every day, cranes arrive from people all over the world who hope and pray and work for peace. Like Sadako's cranes, the exact number of First Pres' cranes is unknown. We estimate it to be more than 3500. Thanks to all who prayed these three-dimensional prayers and helped create our art installation that can now inspire us all to serve the Prince of Peace.

The PCUSA Peace and Global Witness offering, received today and throughout October, is intended to help people experience the freedom and dignity that Christ wants for everyone, everywhere—regardless of boundaries or the walls that separate us. Mentors like Jay and Melissa Anne gave me confidence in connecting with people of different generations and working in both small and large congregations. The highlights during my time at First Pres include my interactions with church members at Glacier Hills, participating in Men's Bible Study groups and mission trips to Russia and Nicaragua."
