Have you been in the Sanctuary lately? Soaring overhead in our sanctuary is a brilliantly hued representation of the prayers of the people. Each flash of color is an origami crane. And inside each bird is written the name of a church member who was prayed for as the bird was folded. Yet the focus of this artwork is larger than any individual or congregation. The work—made up of over 3500 cranes—also marks International Day of Peace, September 21. And in addition, these peace cranes support our annual giving campaign, *Peace by Piece*.
