

- 1 can french-fried onions
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 can pumpkin pie filling
- 1 crust/bake mix
- 2 cans vegetable (carrots, corn, yam, peas, etc).

All items must be shelf-stable (no refrigeration needed) and please avoid glass containers. Make sure your bag has all of the items listed, and no extras.
