Cash and check contributions can be mailed, placed in the plate at any service, or handdelivered to the finance office. A contribution must be received or postmarked by December 31, 2022, in order for it to be considered a 2022 tax deduction. Contributions Envelopes, for those who requested them, will be available outside the Finance Office through December 27. Any envelopes not picked up will be mailed on December 28.

Stock transfers and IRA/DAF contributions must be received in the church's account by December 30, 2022. It is important to initiate the transfer early enough to allow for any yearend delay in transfers being completed.
