


THIRD SUNDAY *of* ADVENT December 17, 2023 • 9:30 a.m.



Her ancestors had long awaited the coming of the Messiah. but it was Marv who first awaited the coming of Jesus. And, according to the Gospel of Luke, as she waited, Mary shared with her cousin Elizabeth the song we call the Magnificat. One beloved interpretation of Mary's song is known as My Soul Cries Out with a Joyful Shout (Canticle of the Turning), Hymn #100 in our hymnal and this year's Advent theme borrows from its imagery and poetry. The God we await in Advent is the same God whom Mary awaited 2,000 years ago: it is Christ who is turning the world around.

The Advent Wreath is shaped in a perfect circle to symbolize the eternity of God. At First Presbyterian we use three blue candles with one candle being rose or pink, to represent joy with one larger white candle in the middle as the Christ candle.

The Third Sunday of Advent is known as "Gaudete Sunday." Gaudete is Latin for "rejoice." The liturgical color for Advent is blue, but the third Sunday of Advent uses rose or pink as its color. Rejoice!





Advent Paperlace Banners

The Advent paperlace banners were designed by liturgical artist Ellen Phillips and were cut by members of FPC. Ellen writes:

We live with hope, we do not despair.

We sit with the hope and a quiet peace fills us.

The Spirit of the Lord is upon [us].

We begin to be aware of a gentle effervescence in our souls, hardly noticeable. The feeling bubbles and begins to rise into our consciousness. There have been other dark days and then things gradually changed and afterwards *our mouth was filled with laughter and our tongue with shouts of joy!*

For as the earth brings forth its shoots and as a garden causes that which is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord will sow righteousness and praise.

In due season, and with lots of work, flowers and vegetables send up their first shoots and slowly, with much care and patience, they send forth beautiful blossoms and nourishing food. Before long the air is filled with the hum of bees, butterflies appear and the sound of birdsong fills the air. With baskets full of bounty, we come rejoicing bringing in the sheaves.

This week's design is based on *The Tree of Life* by Gustav Klimt. The branches swirl energetically and are filled with birds and flowers. This represents the joyful harvest of seeds that although planted in tears, will be sown with shouts of joy. Because of this knowledge, *we can give thanks in all circumstances*. Share and hear prayers, scripture, and music that acknowledge that God's presence is for those who mourn, for those who struggle, and that God's Word comes to shine light into our darkness.


STEWARDSHIP Year-End Giving

A contribution must be received or postmarked by December 31, 2023, in order for it to be considered a 2023 tax deduction. Contributions Envelopes, for those who requested them, will be available outside the Finance Office through December 28. Any envelopes not picked up will be mailed on December 29.
