



Epiphany is the celebration of the revelation of God in Jesus Christ—a holy day (traditionally January 6) that probably predates Christmas. Its primary symbol is Light, connoting illumination and understanding.

The Moravian Star hanging in the Chancel represents the star followed by the Magi, and the light of Christ illuminating our path in the world today. The first Moravian star is known to have originated in the 1830s at the Moravian Boy's School in Niesky, Germany.


