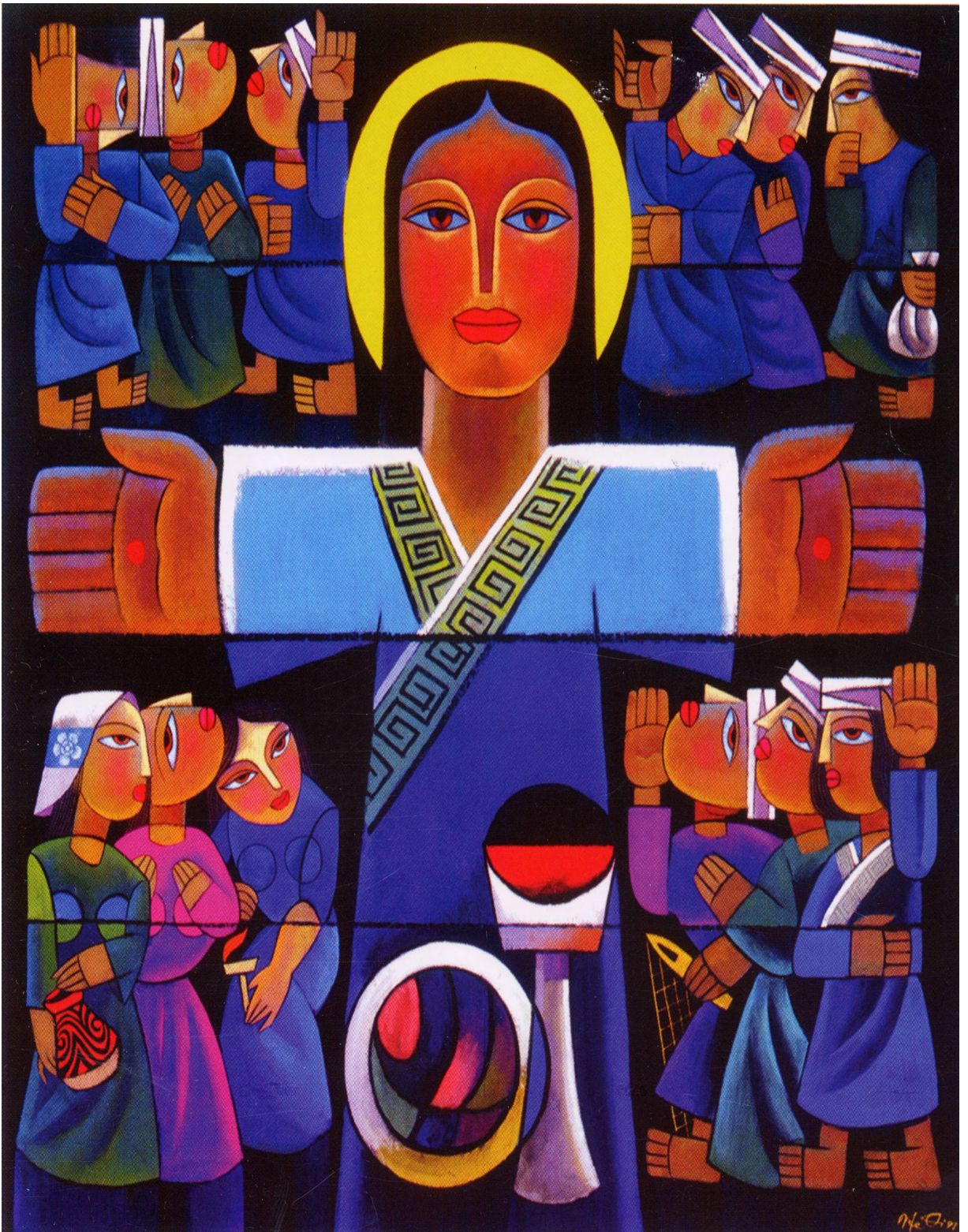

Beginning in April, FPC will host an art exhibit by He Qi in the Social Hall.


Thank you to fiber artist Beth Taylor for creating the new white quilted banners at the front of the Sanctuary. Beth Taylor lives in Meadowview, VA.
