

Celebrated on the 50th day after Easter, Pentecost (from Greek word for "50th day") commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles, which occurred at the end of the Jewish harvest season during a festival in Jerusalem, after Jesus' ascension. On Pentecost, we celebrate God's gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church: the Spirit draws us together in one body, helps us to see what God is doing in the world, and empowers us to respond in word and deed to God's plan to reconcile all creation in the name of Christ.

a place where children explore the flow of worship through multisensory experiences. Children ages 5 through 5th grade are invited to join in Worship Lab each week.


