
CALL TO CONFESSION



Gun Violence Prevention

In Michigan, a woman is killed by an abuser with a gun every week. To address this issue, End Gun Violence Michigan and the Michigan Coalition to End Domestic and Sexual Violence are organizing a day of action on September 18. Press conferences will be held across the state to raise awareness. The groups are advocating for new laws that would prohibit individuals convicted of domestic violence or under a final domestic violence restraining order from owning a gun for 8 years. These bills (SB 678 & 679, HB 5371 & 5372) were introduced in the previous legislative session but did not receive a hearing. The objective is to pass these bills this year. Two press conferences will take place in Lansing at 10 AM and Detroit at 11 AM. Church members are organizing car pools to attend each conference and show silent support for the bills.
