Christ Is Alive! honors the 50th anniversary of the text. Hymn-poet Brian Wren (b. 1936) wrote the text (Hymn No. 108) to be used on Easter 1968, the week after the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., as he felt none of the existing Easter hymns seemed to speak to the needs of his congregation in Hockley, Essex, United Kingdom. Stanza 4 is especially appropriate:

"In every insult, rift, and war, Where color, scorn, or wealth divide, Christ suffers still, yet loves the more, and lives, where even hope has died."
