

PARKING AT FIRST PRES

Following the all church picnic event, the church received a letter from the City of Ann Arbor Fire Department identifying three violations. Two of the items have to do with signage for, and access to, the fire department connection for the church. These items are being addressed by our facilities staff.

The third item has to do with posting and maintaining the necessary fire lanes around the church. This violation reads: "Install 'No Parking – Fire Lane' signs on the outer and inner drive on the north side of the building and around the perimeter of the building to ensure fire engine access around the building. Only diagonal parking that has been approved by the City can be used." The 'No Parking – Fire Lane' signs have been posted so please do not park in these areas. This is not just an issue of convenience for the fire department, it is a necessity for the proper equipment to have access to the building in the event of an emergency at the church.

The handicapped parking spaces along the sidewalk adjacent to the church (parallel parking spaces) are no longer available parking spaces – this is part of the posted fire lane. To make up for these spaces, several of the diagonal spaces across the aisle that were previously non-handicapped parking will be identified as handicapped parking for Sunday services and other special events.
