Dear Friends.

Epiphany is upon us, and many are bracing to start a new year. A new variant is on the rise. Scientists tell us that we need more precautions. The weather is getting colder. The virus is getting bolder. We keep having to pivot to the next best thing. What we thought was a sure-thing last month, fizzled out the second time around. Live-streaming is great, and Zoom is efficient, but we yearn to connect with friends and neighbors more deeply. Without Covid-fear.

But there is good news. We are not starting from scratch. We begin this New Year 2022 with wisdom and experience we

lacked twenty-one months ago. We sit in this season of anticipation and lean into the past lessons that have prepared us for a more promise-filled future. Everyone today has a Covid story. We might not have all the answers, but we've picked up essential coping skills and have both the burden and blessing of enduring a pandemic. We haven't perfected our response, but not only are we still standing, we are trying some new ways of doing church now with confidence.

So pat yourself on the back. You've lost some things, and heartbreakingly, you may also have lost some people. That pain will persist, but you are still here to tell the story that God has been mightily present all throughout the last pandemic months and that is the grace of this moment and the challenge of our future. We did not know what we were doing at some points, but we found a way to adapt and innovate in a time of sudden change.

Now, imagine what is possible. We've experienced the limitations that this pandemic has produced. We've wrapped our heads around the likelihood that we will not return to normal as we knew it. But this Epiphany 2022, I am shifting my gaze to what is possible. Meeting in mid-December, our Session adopted a new First Pres Strategic Plan: "Making God's Love Visible" that puts and keeps us on a path that

blends the genius of innovation with the strength of tradition to shape our future.

Approaching this new year, let's consider what gains have been and might yet be made. What innovation might be birthed? What and where can we create in the midst of a disrupted rhythm of worship, mission and formation? How can we learn from the loss of this year and allow it to inform how we create? As 2022 edges forward, we now have experience to build upon. We have seen how deadly this virus can be and how misinformation can literally kill someone. We've seen how we must live communally, caring for "the least of these" among us in our community.

> What possibilities can emerge from this pandemic-produced climate of care? As we reshape what success looks like, we are also redefining what our new standard is and can express what we want First Pres to be. We have proved that we can innovate in the span of a few weeks what we had thought would take years.

We've proved that people care about one another deeply, as evidenced by the hard work of creating backyard weddings,

communion kits, 10-person funerals, baptisms on Circle Terrace, youth group Zoom parties, social justice meetings under a tent, drive-up celebrations, and all the other ways that we adapted to marking holy and symbolic moments. Don't forget our grit. Remember our resilience. Don't forget our communal care for one another. As this year closes and another dawns, what is possible?

Susan Gott and other church leaders will share our new Strategic Plan on several occasions in 2022 — look for the dates. And remember — we're are no longer starting from scratch. We're starting from experience.

MATURE MINISTRIES

Mature Ministries to Discover Detroit's Lost Black Neighborhood

Detroit's Black Bottom neighborhood—the area in Detroit where Blacks were legally restricted to live in during much of the city's history—was destroyed as the interstate highway system cut through the city, and racial unrest destroyed or compromised much of what remained. Using archival photographs of the neighborhood as her starting point, architect Emily Kutil created an exhibition that recreated the neighborhood visually and drew former residents to visit, reconnect, and share stories of the vibrant life of this community.





Ms. Kutil, Assistant Professor of Architecture at Lawrence Technological University, will be the featured speaker in a Lunch & Learn Zoom session, Thursday, January 13, at noon. Dr. Peg Talburtt will discuss the topic "Human Trafficking: what it is and what you can do about it." Dr. Talburtt recently retired as Executive Director of the Lovelight Foundation, a private women's foundation that has funded a number of projects in the field of human trafficking, particularly those having to do with child sex trafficking in the United States. This is an issue she has followed for decades since she worked with a group of teen girl grant makers who believed trafficked teens were a REAL issue. Through her work in several foundations over the last twenty-five years, she has been able to watch the development of comprehensive trafficking programs in Atlanta, Minnesota, New York,

and Florida, among other locations. She is a current member of the MI Human Trafficking Task Force, chairs the Resource Committee of the MI Attorney General's Michigan Human Trafficking Commission, and is a community leader for MAP-Ann Arbor, an anti-trafficking volunteer organization.


PW Mission – Gifts of the Season Sewing Angels & Fabric Needed!



Rotating Homeless Shelter Program at First Pres is "Pressing" Forward

First Presbyterian Church Ann Arbor has a 20+ year history of working with the Shelter Association of Washtenaw County by offering a warm welcome to un-housed men on cold winter nights. We are preparing to renew this offer in January 2022 (Jan. 3 – Jan. 17) after being unable to do so last winter due to Covid safety concerns. We will be taking extra care to keep the men and our volunteers safe by ensuring safe distancing between sleeping areas, limiting food supplied to pre-packaged snacks and coffee, juice, andwater, and limiting opportunities for the guests and our volunteers to sit together at tables for socialization. First Pres volunteers will be scheduled to welcome arrivals each evening following the dinner provided at the Delonis Center when the Shelter van delivers our guests to the Social Hall around 7:15 p.m. We will also provide 3-4 volunteers to spend each night at the church to share the hours between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. splitting shifts to oversee the sleeping hours.

The Shelter Program assures us the men in the Rotating cohort will, as in past years, be committed to their pledge of safe practices with regard to Covid and being free of alcohol. Regular testing of all men at the Shelter for COVID continues at least every 2 weeks. These are particularly challenging times for everyone which also means our ability to help provide comfort to the men is especially precious. It is another way for First Pres to Make God's Love Visible.

Local Mission Grant Program Supports Delonis in 2021, and Gears up for 2022

Every year First Pres supports our neighbors in need through grants to local community agencies. In 2021 we distributed \$73,000 through 12 grants each worth between \$5,000 and 10,000. Some grants go to our long-time partners, such as Alpha House, Habitat for Humanity, and Friends-In-Deed. For 2021, the Shelter Association at Delonis Center requested help to re-open the second floor of the shelter, which had been closed prior to COVID due to lack of funds. Eventually this program expansion will increase their capacity by 50%, or 100 clients per year!

The Local Mission Grant Program is gearing up for 2022 and would welcome your input! During January we will be reviewing our funding priorities and the application process. JFS Co-Sponsorship Program for Afghanistan Refugees

Our partners at Jewish Family Services (JFS) are rolling out a new co-sponsorship program that would allow our church to sponsor a particular family and support them during their first 12 months in the U.S. JFS would offer guidance, but First Pres would be primarily responsible for coordinating volunteers, support, and community for the family we would be paired with.

Before we sign up for this program, we need to gauge volunteer interest to determine if we can faithfully serve and sufficiently meet the needs of the family we will be paired with. This is no small undertaking, JFS estimates that each church will need teams of around 30 volunteers contributing a collective 40 hours/week of volunteer service, for at least the first two months after a family's arrival.
