ARTISTS' BIOGRAPHIES

Imani Mchunu, soprano, is a graduate student at the University of Michigan where she also completed her bachelor's degree. Imani won the first prize in the MuTeOr sponsored National Association of Negro Musicians (NANM) competition in 2019 and received a runner-up prize in UofM Friends of Opera Competition in 2020. She is thrilled to serve First Presbyterian Church of Ann Arbor as a choir section leader.

Catherine Moore, mezzo soprano, is a junior at the University of Michigan School of Music, Theatre & Dance studying Choral Music Education and minoring in Performing Arts Management and Entrepreneurship. She studies piano with Dr. Matthew Bengtson, and voice with DMA candidate JoAna Rusche. She is a member of the University of Michigan Chamber Choir, conducted by Dr. Eugene Rogers. Catherine hails from Westfield, New Jersey, and has been a section leader at First Presbyterian since Fall of 2019.

Tyrese Byrd, tenor, is a native of Greenville, SC, and is currently pursuing a Masters of Music degree at the University of Michigan while studying with Dr. Louise Toppin. He completed his undergraduate studies at Furman University. Tyrese has competed for several years in the NATS Student Auditions where he has won state and regional awards, as well as recognition as a three-time national finalist. He received his M.Mus. in church music from the University of Michigan, and his B.Mus. in organ performance from the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music.
