During the five weeks from July 25 through August 22, our gospel readings are from the sixth chapter of the gospel of John, and all are directly related to bread. Beginning with the feeding of the 5000, we hear Jesus remind us of the manna, the bread from heaven that fed the ancient Hebrew people in the desert, and distinguish it from the bread of life, the spiritual bread that was Jesus. "I am the Bread of Life," "I am the Living Bread," "If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever." "For the bread of God is that which comes down out of heaven, and gives life to the world." Like the bread in our scripture, the breads in our world can take many forms, just a few of which you will see on our communion table over the coming weeks.




