
BAPTISM OF THE LORD SUNDAY January 10, 2021

Today we celebrate Baptism of the Lord Sunday. Jesus' ministry to bring in the Reign of God was inaugurated in his baptism. As he came out of the water, the Spirit rested on Jesus, and God said, "You are my son, the Beloved. With you I am well pleased." On this day, we celebrate not only Jesus' baptism but our own as well, for our baptism is rooted in Christ, joining us to him and his church. With all of the beloved of God we are called to share in Christ's ministry.




